2020 SIXTO ROZA HILLS CHARDONNAY

TASTING NOTES BY WINEMAKER CHARLES SMITH

Opulent is the first to come to mind yet also restrained. A gentle release of peach, hazelnut and fresh sweet cream continuing forever with toasted spices, roasted lemon, shortbread and a focused essence of chalk. Silky to the core. Lavish. Get lost in the glass for a moment, while striving to seek out the memory of “brilliance.”

VINTAGE NOTES

The 2020 vintage might be the best vintage that we have ever had in Washington state history. We had an incredible growing season that was long and temperate, allowing the fruit to ripen evenly. The wines are focused, rich, complex and lively. The reds are restrained and elegant, yet powerful with incredible tension and balance. Our white and rosé wines are wonderfully rich on the palate but balanced with enough acid to make the wines complete. We are excited to see how these wines evolve!

“Rich, round and focused ... impressive with layers of spicy oak essence that waft with white and yellow flowers over a delightfully dusty core. Full-bodied and with elevated alcohol of 14.5%, the wine reveals a balanced and mineral-driven expression on the palate, exposing a generously textured and complex mouthfeel and ends with a showy but boozy finish. It will likely please lovers of New World, generously structured Chardonnay.”

“Attractive aromas of peaches, grilled pineapple, pastry crust, young walnuts and salted butter. Full and layered with a creamy, textural, mouth-feel and delicious stone-fruit character. It’s crunchy and lively, but firm and structured at the same time. Plush and fruity finish with some chalkiness. Drink or hold.”

“A wine of contrasts, the 2020 Chardonnay Roza Hills is spicy and rich in the glass with a burst of crushed green apples, flinty stone and sage. This splashes across the palate with ripe orchard fruits and an inner custardy richness, as sour citrus nuances add balance toward the close. Wet stone and exotic spices linger throughout, as young peach and crushed almond notes slowly taper off. This is transporting me to Burgundy.”

VINEYARD

Roza Hills Vineyard (100%)

At an elevation of 1350 feet, Roza Hills Vineyard is located in a southern sloping bowl, on the south side of the Rattlesnake Hills. Planted in 1977, the majority of the vines are located in soils of loamy silt and chalk, with broken basalt chunks interspersed.
